EVERY YEAR, GLOBALLY, APPROXIMATELY 30 MILLION DOGS & 10 MILLION CATS ARE KILLED FOR THEIR MEAT

On July 20, 2023, H.Con. Res.59 was introduced into the House of Representatives. The Resolution urges all countries to outlaw the dog and cat meat trade and to enforce existing laws against such trade.

In 2018, the U.S. officially banned the slaughter of dogs and cats for meat in the Farm Bill.

However, in other countries, dogs and cats are still killed for their meat. Some dogs are raised in factory farms. Other dogs and cats are stolen family pets or strays that are trafficked into the meat trade.

At slaughterhouses, killing methods include beating, bludgeoning, electrocution, and being boiled alive.
